**[PHOTOGRAPHY] [INDIA]** Patterson, J.A. **Sister in Charge. Album of Original Photographs of Chakrala British Military Hospital. India : Unpublished, 1938.** Oblong 12" by 9 1/2" black paper covered boards, cord bound with 25 leaves. An album of 68 original photographs of the Chakrala British Military Hospital, by or for Sister-in-Charge, Jane Amelia Patterson, of staff, patients, wards and the local vicinity including the mountainous Sahiya. Including a laid in large format photograph of 69 members of staff taken in September 1938 with senior staff identified on the reverse.


Sister Jane Amelia Patterson went on to have a distinguished war career, receiving 1st and 2nd class Royal Red Cross medals and in 1946 a CBE. Unusually she turns up as a character in "Some Sunny Day" a modern nursing romance novel by Madge Lambert. Very good. 375.00

**[SCRAPBOOK][CRICKET]** Ellerton, Geoffrey J. **Scrapbook Album of The British Public Schools Cricket Team Tour to Canada and the United States. London, United States and Canada: 1939.** Hardcover album 12 1/4" x 9 1/2" bound in dark red boards with heavy discoloration to back. The scrapbook created by Geoffrey J. Ellerton, one of the young players, documents the tour with programs, game scores, post cards, travel cards, advertisements, maps, newspaper articles, match books, photographs and other assorted ephemera, some signed by the players.

The worsening state of affairs with Hitler and Germany is documented in attached newspaper clippings. On September 1st 1939 while the young men were still overseas, war was declared in England. Another newspaper article records some of the young men's comments on the situation and their potentially perilous voyage home. Good. 300.00

**[PHOTOGRAPHY][INDIA]** Miss Shaw. **Photograph Album. Unknown: Unpublished, 1915.** First Edition. Created by a Miss Shaw, it contains 160 b/w photographs on 53 pages and forms a pictorial record of her trip from England to India, between late 1915 and early 1917, along with her friend "Pixie." The album measures a fraction under 10" by 8" and the leaves are heavy card stock with a little foxing toward the edges. A couple are loose but still attached, mostly sharp with some being a little faded or overexposed but generally well composed for amateur photographers.

The majority of the photographs have small handwritten captions which help to create an overall impression of her experiences there. A number are of "Self" and/or "Pixie" with small groups of acquaintances, often young men, at equestrian events, trips to the bazaar, at the rifle range, a summer trip to Darjeeling etc. There are also pictures of her return to England, where she became a volunteer nurse at an auxiliary hospital in Kent. Pixie is noticeably absent on the return voyage. Very good. 650.00





Cover shows some rubbing with chipping to edges and heavier wear to corners. From the book. "It is a curious fact that in this age of scientific research, the absurd follies of spiritualism should find an increase in

supporters....One thing we hope in some measure to further in the following pages, is the extinction of the superstitious belief that apparitions are actual spirits, by showing some of the many ways in which our senses may be deceived"

This the author seeks to achieve this by instructing the reader on how to use the color plates to create an optical illusion and then giving a scientific explanation of how the eye can be so deceived. A unique combination of art, optical illusion and science, now somewhat scarce in the trade. Very good. 500.00

Unknown: Unpublished, Ca 1946.** Small, apparently hand made, oblong photograph album 8 1/4" by 6" containing twelve b/w photographs of five Berlin landmarks before and after the devastating allied bombing and shelling of the city during World War Two and two of the Soviet War Memorial.

**[WWI][NURSING]** Millicent, Duchess of Sutherland. **Six Weeks at the War. Chicago: A.C. McClurg & Co., 1915.** First Edition. Octavo. Black cloth over boards with red cross and text to front cover. [xv] 115pp. Heavy fading to spine otherwise very good throughout.

British organisations, individuals and groups of friends gave lavishly of funds, stores and the services of trained nurses to the French, Belgian and Serbian Allies and, by 17 August 1914, Millicent had installed an ambulance with eight trained nurses and a surgeon, Mr. Oswald Morgan of Guys' Hospital, in Namur. This became the No 9 Red Cross Hospital (Millicent Duchess of Sutherland's Ambulance) and it was established in the Convent of Les Soeurs de Notre Dame. On 22 August 1914 German forces attacked Namur and the hospital was inundated with wounded soldiers. In her book 'Six Weeks at the War' which is in fact a diary, she gives a graphic account of her experiences on that day. - The Western Front Association. Good.

The experiences of Mary Dexter from Boston who arrived in Paignton, UK in September 1914. During the following two years she took on nursing duties in De Panne, Belgium. Subsequently, while recovering from scarlet fever, she began to study applied psychology at London's Medico-Psychological Clinic with the hope of working with shell-shock patients. - Jeffrey S. Reznick, U.S. National Library of Medicine.

Annotated in a later hand, with emphasis on PTSD, 'shell-shock' and hysteria. Fair. 125.00

A graduate of Cardiff University, Wales Minnie Pallister was a Feminist, Socialist and Peace Activist, renowned for her rousing and thoughtful oratory, whose promising career was curtailed due to ill health at a relatively young age after which she concentrated upon her writing.

Contained in The Orange-Box are her views on the necessity and nature of socialist propaganda particularly with a view toward the new woman voter. Good. 125.00
